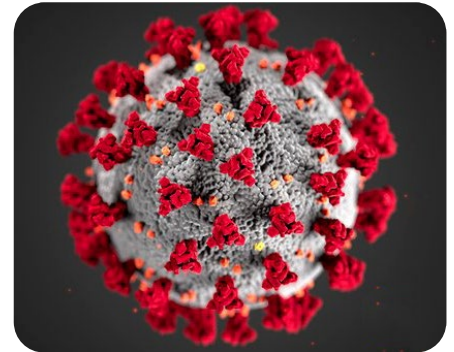


## Worried about Coronavirus? We have some information and resources that might help
